## Business Person:

You represent the development co.

## Journalist:

You are here to report the meeting. You are suspicious of the Development Co. You have seen other villages developed and their character destroyed. Will the company keep their promises or are they lying?

## Pension Owner:

You have a small pension but you have always dreamed of owning a large hotel. If the Holiday village is built and the roads improved, more visitors will come to Binkilic.

You also own the local coffee house and cafes. You are planning to convert them into restaurants and discos. You could be rich.

You need to persuade you fellow villagers of the advantages of the scheme

# Police:

You have been the only policeperson here for the last 25 years.

It's a quiet place and there's never any trouble.

You like your job and you're worried that there would be problems if they build discos, bars and clubs in the town.

If crime increases, they might send other more senior police from Istanbul

#### Fisherman:

You are a fisherman and own 3 small boats.

However, the stock of fish in the Black Sea has decreased in the last 3 years and it's difficult to make any money, especially when you compete with large boats from Istanbul using modern equipment. You are interested in the Holiday village and think you could use your boats to take visitors on boat trips

## Old Person:

You have lived in Binkilic all your life and don't want to change. You HATE visitors and the idea of noisy discos, drinks, cars at night etc. What effect will all this have on the young people in the village? You're worried about the local character being destroyed.
